## **Discussion Questions—Food for Thought**

## Chapter Two

1. Maybe Amanda didn't like making phone calls either. Maybe she was glad to not have to interrupt the fun of the sleep-over to do it herself. Maybe she thought Nolan was nice to be a part of the mystery.

2. People like to know when we appreciate them. This may be one way of showing kindness or love, especially when that person is particularly appreciative of words of encouragement. One way to try to find a Scripture about this is to look in a concordance or do a "search" on an electronic Bible for words such as "love," "kindness," "encouragement," "words," etc.

## Chapter Three

3. Amanda and Jane liked crafts and helping out at church. Maybe their parents suggested they make good use of their free time during the summer. Some ideas for helping others could be: doing an extra chore at home, doing regular chores without complaining, helping prepare a meal by making sandwiches or something, and asking adults at church if there is anything you can do to help.

4. The Bible says that God created all land animals on Day 6 of the week of Creation. This stands in stark contrast to what much information in the world espouses about dinosaurs. Maybe you can have a discussion with your parents on what this could mean. (Christian companies with excellent resources on this subject include Answers in Genesis and The Institute for Creation Research.)

## Chapter Seven
